Our membership numbers remained steady. In 2020 we had a total of 656 registered members and in 2021 we had 654 registered members. This is a great effort considering the effects of COVID on the community. Our NSG registrations and Junior registrations have increased this year which is a positive sign for the future.

Our junior rep carnival was a success in June with 54 teams competing in 7 different divisions. It was wonderful to see all the courts being utilised across the whole day. This year we had 21 net set go teams split into 4 grades.
