ANNUAL REPORT 2020

PRESIDENTS REPORT

When the definitive history of Australian netball is written and, history itself, expect 2020 to be remembered as a watershed year. It has made immense changes in the way so many people do or even think about something, their working lives completely changed, home schooling and our kids which I personally think we really did not understand the impact that their Saturday sport played such a huge part of their everyday life. This is not just teenagers but 8yrs up who have routines and love their netball and other activities.

After doing some research and talking to the kids helpline, salvation army and the Office of Sport it had been identified that the affects to the kids mental health and well-being at grass root level was having quite high impact and realising that it was so important for all sporting organisations to do what they could to offer some programs in their season allocations. Hence why after consulting your club presidents I decided to send the survey to each member as this also needed to be your decision as I have said many times before and will probably say again before the end of this WWPNA is owned by the members, not WWPNA executive, nor the clubs executive. We are here to ensure all our Governing Bodies policies & Procedures are adhered to and your clubs do as well, and that our members have a safe, welcoming environment, free of bullying, harassment and victimisation and an all-inclusive atmosphere.

So, the 2020 season was particularly challenging, expensive BUT above all most rewarding. COVID presented many challenging, difficult, and extremely frustrating circumstances. Nic and I had been dealing with this since the beginning of the year. The constant changes to regulations, laws and policies became so overwhelming as they could come through daily, weekly. In the end we felt like we needed a law degree and possibly had just graduated from the police academy as we were going to be expected to now enforce all these rules. Then be a solicitor to defend ourselves if a Government Inspector turned up and we were found to not have done something correctly. All the information received was never clear nor concise so anything was possible 😊 We got through it in the end and Nic you were amazing and I couldn't and wouldn't have wanted to do it with anyone else as you are so efficient in what you do and logistically brilliant 😊 So, thank you to all our clubs for all that you have done as it was not easy for you either and to our members thank you for your patience and understanding.

When the Federal Government invested \$30 million it was an unprecedented commitment to our sport, providing additional resources in our future for NA to use in a focused, tailored, and strategic way. It was also an endorsement of the sport's decades-long position as the nation's pre-eminent sport for women and girls. Netball families are leaders at all different levels in their community, change, connection, and inclusion, and we should continue to listen, learn, and evolve from this.

The netball environment is changing rapidly, and it presents many challenges at all levels of our game especially grassroots. But as a sport we need to hold tight our history and traditions and learn from our past but must not be afraid to embrace **new ideas and innovations and move forward with the future** otherwise we will be left behind again. We have worked hard over the past couple of years to bring WWPNA to where it is today, and the future is looking bright providing we stay on the same path. This includes giving our members a say and having you attend meetings.

If I am honest how many of you have contacted your clubs prior to a council meeting to request them to ask a question of the minutes of the previous meeting on your behalf? We put these council minutes on the website, so you all had access to them after members had approached us and said they never received copies. I have never had a question raised from a member though through their club. You are entitled to a say, you may not be able to verbally voice it now but there are other ways either by emailing your club to be addressed on your behalf or email wwpna@bigpond.com No question or suggestion is a wrong one and is always welcome.

At a recent 2 day conference I attended last Wednesday and Thursday one the most informative pieces of information that I got from it and there is a lot more but this one in particular as I think we only might have one club who does attend the school they are involved with. The biggest jump in 2019/2020 came through Sport Australia's Sporting Schools program, with the number of schools involved up 6.5% to 774 and individual participants soaring by 41% to 62,776. These participants then went on to register with their local netball associations in their winter/summer competitions. I would encourage all clubs to email our local schools and send through information on your registration days or possibly arrange an information day at the school.

Next year I will be working with the Sporting Schools Program for the schools on the Peninsula. I am discussing this with NNSW now and we are in the process of the application for funding. What I would like to do and why it is still being discussed is so the Program is all inclusive, there should be no barriers for anyone especially a child regardless of their disability, race, or sexuality. Through leadership and determination, netball delivers social, health, wellbeing, and economic benefits to Australian communities. Most importantly, it produces visible and tangible results when it comes to equal equality."

I am registered with them and this is another area within our community I have identified in the past four months after doing some research, speaking to the principals and teachers involved in their netball programs that they were unaware of the sporting schools program and great initiatives and funding through the government that they can apply for. It was so apparent at the last Gala Day this year down at the courts and at previous events I have attended when schools from out of the region have attended. They do not have the resources, not even a playing uniform, there was only one school that did, and I helped them with that four years ago in applying for the funding. It is about building that relationship back up and hopefully encouraging more to come and register with a club to play on Saturdays as well.

Indigenous Round

I have been approached by NNSW to hold the States Koori Gala Day on Sunday 22nd August which was in Dubbo this year. They have 5 Divisions, Junior mixed 12&U, Junior Girls 12-15, Junior Mixed 12-15 Opens Women's and Opens Mixed.

Also, from this event players 12-14 are selected to attend the NNSW Indigenous Talent Camp

This is a big event for Indigenous athletes, and I have been working with Office of Sport in collaboration with NNSW in finding more ways to be more inclusive with our Indigenous community.

I will provide more details as this comes to hand. This is a great opportunity for the Association to be involved with and to be proud to be apart as we are supported by and wear on our rep uniform Mingaletta's Logo.

Confident Girls Foundation

Netball Australia is the sole member of the Confident Girls Foundation, a not-for-profit public company limited by guarantee which is established to be, and to continue as, a charity.

Netball Australia and the Confident Girls Foundation entered into a Partnership Agreement to promote the longer-term self-sustaining economic viability and growth of the Foundation, deliver social impact outcomes, and align with netball's community strategy, netball development, community engagement and commercial priorities. Subsequently, Partnership Agreements were executed with all Netball Australia Member Organisations and Suncorp Super Netball Clubs.

The Foundation is the official charity partner of Netball Australia, the Australian Diamonds, Suncorp Super Netball, NetFest, Suncorp NetSetGO and the Deakin University Australian Netball League.

In 2019, Netball Australia provided enabling services to the Foundation, including marketing, design, communication, legal and finance. ***The Foundation granted more than \$295,000 to Netball Australia, Member Organisations, Suncorp Super Netball Clubs, and the netball community to provide opportunities for vulnerable Australian girls, women, and their communities to thrive through netball.*** Our goal should always be to continue to grow, year after year and Netball continues to be at the forefront of the growth of women's sport in Australia.

If you see the opportunity to be involved with confident girls, I encourage this and I am looking into opportunities at present.

Clubhouse

The new clubhouse floor plans were signed off today and are going to engineering tender. Whilst initially the next level up at council will not sign off as it is coming in over budget, this to me sounded ridiculous considering a brick has not been knocked out yet or a shovel of dirt dug up, but I won't go into all the bureaucracy of how it is worked out, today has seen the budget reviewed and final signoff achieved. Note: Luckily as the grant we received is Federally funded (considering our council at the moment) but is also why it is under and all federal grant builds strict financial reviews to ensure the budget allocated will cover the whole build including any incidentals as CCC will not be contributing to any of them even though they are their assets.

Stephen Bourke and I have formed a great relationship and are working really well with Wade who is the Project Manager for CCC and Karen O'Mara and they have both been extremely helpful and obliging in ensuring our requests and needs of the Association are met and in fact the whole architectural design has been drawn up off the facility brief we provided and CCC has not had any input apart from advising on regulations and codes which did mean changing some things.

The additions of the new clubhouse include wheelchair access, a large storage area, players changerooms with showers (this was important considering we have players that also umpire, coach and need a separate space to change), wheelchair access toilet facilities, control room, physio/first aid room, large clubhouse room with kitchenette, , canteen, canteen storage, administration office for meetings/secretaries documentation/mums and bubs baby change room (which on the plans is called a multi-purpose room as according to "council policies for sporting grounds they are not required to cater for this"). There is now overhanging shelter out from the front of the building to allow people to stand/sit under for protection from the weather with some concrete steps along as seating.

As the building has to be raised due to the survey conducted and the swamp we are on there will be a veranda that goes around the clubhouse which will also have an awning to protect you from the weather.

The water tanks that are there will be gone and replaced with one water tank, this tank will service the toilets and when empty as the system does now it will switch to town water.

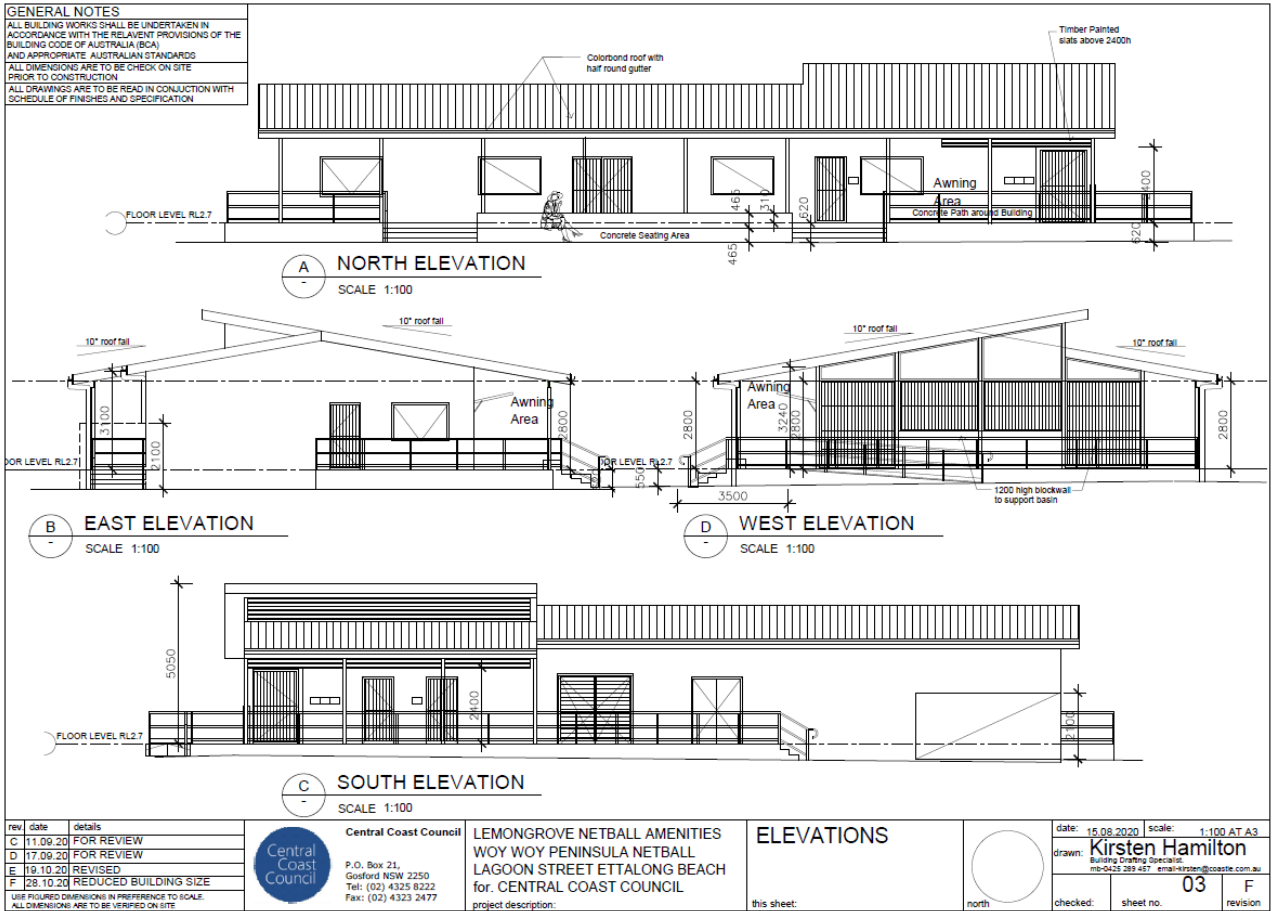
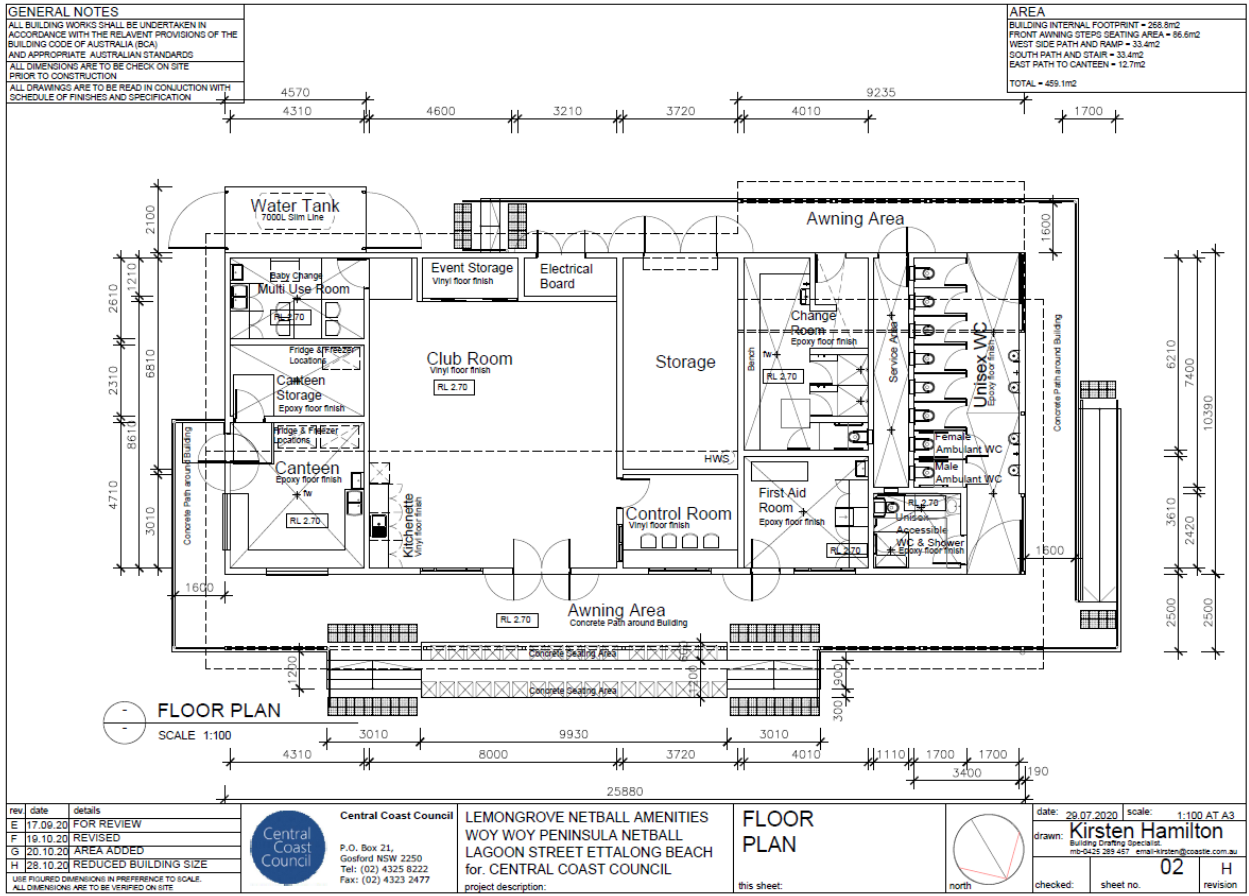
This budget so far does not include furnishings, hence why Stephen, Liesl and I have started working on Grant funding as there will be landscaping to be done and furnishings for inside. We also need our speaker system reinstalled. I have asked that the cabinetry from the clubhouse be removed and reused in the new clubhouse as this is still in good working order and if we want it can be painted to give it more of an updated look which would be quite cheap. The canteen is the only room that Wade thinks will be fitted out with cupboards and benches, but this will all be stainless steel and open under bench shelves.

I have expressed my concerns and dislike with this as being open all the time will only leave everything exposed to the dust and dirt that we do get in the canteen. He was taking this back to council, but I have also asked about using our cabinetry in the canteen as well as the stainless steel. We are also looking at a small cool room instead of all the fridges that the canteen has, this will be more energy and cost effective in the long term but again an added cost.

The enclosed BBQ area is still being negotiated and cannot be included in this actual plan. It can be built along with it but needs to be discussed with Open Spaces in further detail and again a different budget but included in the grant funding.

- The timeline is it will go to Engineering Tender – takes maximum 13 weeks
- Out to Construction Tender – 8 weeks
- WWPNA need to hire shipping containers to store all equipment, items from clubhouse, canteen, shed etc
- Building will begin as soon as GF is over next year
- Complete Build in 5 months (keep in mind loose Christmas period) so my advice is when planning season for 2021 try to start early.

FINANCE

Financials will look different this year due to the late start to the season. Not all income and expenses came in over the usual financial year (eg. Rego fees, rep refunds)

Lost income due to WWPNA reducing their portion of registration fees.

The cancelled first round of Hunter Regional League was costly (portaloos, canteen purchases, catering items).

Lost income due to canteen not opening straight away once the season commenced.

Major expense of new Rep Uniform stock purchase.

Major expense of COVID in general. Cleaning expenses, cleaning items and hand sanitiser.

Reps is usually a big expense for the Association, however due to the cancellation of State Titles, we saved some money. All deposits on Accommodation have been refunded.

GAMES AND GRADING

Wow what a year 2020 was! It certainly was a trying and restrictive year and I just wanted to thank everyone for their patience and help throughout the year in particular the clubs games and grading co-ordinators Jo, Chanel, Fiona, Kylie and Catherine for your assistance and team work in making a horrible unprecedented season bearable. I am very grateful for the support given to me throughout the year. Due to COVID open day was cancelled and the season shortened. I know that this was difficult for all involved however in the end a successful 2020 was had.

This year we had 21 net set go teams split into 4 grades, we stuck with last year's format of having NSG in the 2 x time slots. 10am – lowest two grades – NSG White & Purple & 11am- Highest two grades- NSG Blue & Green. Unfortunately, again due to COVID we were unable to hold our NSG celebration day which was such a success last year and am looking forward to it being implemented again next year! We are also very lucky to have some great players coming through the NSG grades! It was also great to see some more male players participating in our great game this year and hopefully this again increases next year.

We had four senior grades this year, 20 teams in total, two IJ grades consisting of 5 teams each and two junior grades 11 teams in total. As a games and grading committee we decided to regrade after the first round moving some teams to allow a more equal competition based on the results up to that round which meant a draw change and again want to thank the games and grading committee as well as the umpires for the way we all worked together as a team to get this done in such a short time frame. As a collective the games and grading coordinators decided that due to the shortened season to amend the finals series to first two past the post play off in a grand final but also play 3v4 to try to give all players as much court time as possible and again I know this was difficult in terms of umpires, but again what a great Association we have and everyone came together to help out. Hopefully over the next few years as the NSG progress up the grades this will strengthen the junior and IJ grades and allow for a stronger competition.

A big congratulations to all teams that made the grand finals and looking forward to another successful year in 2021.

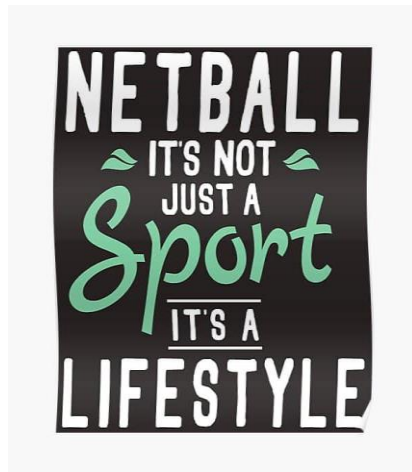
